### Consultation on implementing the Agreement on International Humane Trapping Standards (AIHTS) in the UK

1. I am writing to invite views on proposals for the implementation of the [Agreement on International Humane Trapping Standards \(AIHTS\)](#) in the UK in order to improve the welfare of certain trapped animal species, and to gather information on the supply, use and marking of traps to better inform our impact assessment.
2. The AIHTS chiefly impacts on those who trap species covered by the Agreement, especially the gamekeeping sector, who regularly and widely catch stoats to protect game birds. Trap retailers, manufacturers and importers, pest control companies, country estates/farms, and importers of products derived from trapped animals will also be affected..
